STATE CORRECTIONS PROFILE

COURT ORDER REQUIREMENTS

THE MARYLAND DIVISION OF CORRECTIONS IS CURRENTLY UNDER A FEDERAL COURT ORDER FOR THE YEAR ENDING JUNE 30, 2005. THE FEDERAL COURT ORDER (IN PLACE SINCE 1975) REQUIRES A CERTAIN NUMBER OF INMATES PER INSTITUTION, PROVISIONS FOR MEDICAL CARE, RECREATION, GRIEVANCE PROCEDURES, AND BASIC CONDITIONS OF CONFINEMENT.



STATE INITIATIVES

ELDERLY OR INFIRMED INMATES

EACH FACILITY IN MARYLAND MAY HAVE DESIGNATED AREAS OF HOUSING FOR THE INFIRMED OR MEDICALLY COMPROMISED WHICH INCLUDES THE ELDERLY. A SKILLED NURSING HOME ENVIRONMENT WITHIN THE INFIRMARY SETTING IS NOT FORMALIZED. ANY PATIENT WHO CAN NOT GO TO GENERAL POPULATION, SELF CARE, ETC. USUALLY GOES TO AN INFIRMARY AREA.

PRISON BASED SUBSTANCE ABUSE TREATMENT PROGRAMS

CURRENTLY, MARYLAND PROVIDES TWO LEVELS OF SUBSTANCE ABUSE TREATMENT AND A THIRD THROUGH A PRIVATE VENDOR. ALL PROGRAMS ARE COGNITIVE BEHAVIORAL IN THEIR PHILOSOPHY. THE STANDARD LEVEL OF CARE PROVIDED IS CALLED THE ADDICTION TREATMENT PROTOCOL AND IS OFFERED AT 9 DIFFERENT DOC INSTITUTIONS AND AT THE CENTRAL HOME DETENTION UNIT. IT IS 6 MONTHS LONG AND CONSISTS OF TWO 1-HOUR GROUP SESSIONS PER WEEK AND AN INDIVIDUAL SESSION AT LEAST EVERY 2 WEEKS.

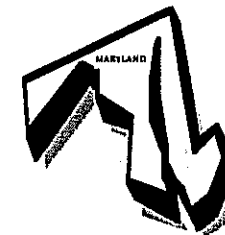
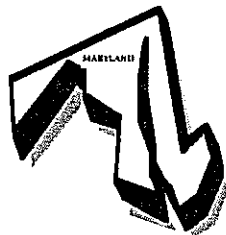
INMATES WITH MORE INTENSE ADDICTION ISSUES COMBINED WITH CO-OCCURRING DISORDERS AND/OR WITH MANY CRIMINOGENIC FACTORS TO BE ADDRESSED ARE REFERRED TO A THERAPEUTIC COMMUNITY LEVEL OF CARE. THE ANNUAL CAPACITY IN THIS LEVEL OF CARE IS 636. THESE COMMUNITIES WILL OFFER SERVICES FOR WOMEN AT THE MARYLAND CORRECTIONAL INSTITUTE FOR WOMEN IN JESSUP AND MARYLAND CORRECTIONAL TRAINING CENTER FOR MALES IN HAGERSTOWN.

THERE IS A PRIVATIZED CO-OCCURRING DISORDERS PROGRAM AT THE METROPOLITAN TRANSITION CENTER FUNDED BY BALTIMORE CITY. THE 6 MONTH PROGRAM IS UNIQUE IN THAT COMMUNITY PROVIDERS OFFER WEEKLY COUNSELING SERVICES, WHICH INTEGRATES PROGRAMMING FOR ADDICTS WITH PERSONALITY DISORDERS. INMATES PARTICIPATING IN THE PROGRAMS ARE TRACKED WHILE IN TREATMENT AND GOALS ARE CLOSELY MONITORED. ON A MONTHLY BASIS, ALL PROGRAMS SUBMIT REPORTS ON A VARIETY OF PERFORMANCE MEASURES THAT ARE ANALYZED FOR TRENDS AND IMPROVEMENT.

STATE INITIATIVES (CONTINUED)



PRE-RELEASE/POST-RELEASE ("REENTRY") PROGRAMS

SERIOUS AND VIOLENT OFFENDER REENTRY INITIATIVE (SVORI) AND MARYLAND REENTRY PARTNERSHIP (REP):

SVORI IS A COMPREHENSIVE EFFORT THAT ADDRESSES BOTH JUVENILE AND ADULT POPULATIONS OF SERIOUS, HIGH-RISK OFFENDERS. THE MARYLAND REP PROGRAM BEGAN MORE THAN 5 YEARS AGO OUT OF INTENSE CONCERN THAT NOT ENOUGH WAS BEING DONE TO PREPARE ADULT OFFENDERS TO RETURN HOME AS CONTRIBUTING MEMBERS OF THEIR COMMUNITIES. THE ADULT OFFENDERS IN REP REPRESENT A SUBSTANTIAL RISK TO THE PUBLIC UPON THEIR RELEASE (1/3 HAVING BEEN CONVICTED OF A VIOLENT ASSAULT). THE INITIATIVE PROVIDES AN INTERAGENCY REENTRY PILOT PROGRAM THAT JOINS TOGETHER CORRECTIONS, COMMUNITY, LAW ENFORCEMENT, HOUSING ORGANIZATIONS, AND SERVICE PROVIDERS IN A STRUCTURED PROCESS TO ADDRESS THE ISSUES OF OFFENDERS RETURNING TO FIVE ZIP CODES IN BALTIMORE. REP HAS CASE MANAGERS AND ADVOCATES THAT ARE EMPLOYED BY COMMUNITY AGENCIES TO ASSIST THE OFFENDER FOR SUCCESSFUL RE-INTEGRATION.

REP HAS PROVIDED SERVICES TO 350 TRANSITIONING EX-OFFENDERS THROUGH JUNE 2005. THE PROGRAM'S RETENTION RATE IS 70%, AND THE PROGRAM'S RECIDIVISM RATE RANGES FROM 16-19%, WITH TECHNICAL VIOLATIONS MAKING UP TO 11-14% OF THAT RATE. OF THE ACTIVELY PARTICIPATING INDIVIDUALS: 87% ARE UNDER P&P SUPERVISION, 44% LIVE IN TRANSITIONAL HOUSING, 69% HAVE RECEIVED PHYSICAL EXAMINATIONS, 13% RECEIVED MENTAL HEALTH SCREENINGS, 22% ARE ENROLLED IN SUBSTANCE ABUSE PROGRAMS, AND 60% ARE EMPLOYED.

MARYLAND ALSO HAS A RESTART (REENTRY ENFORCEMENT SERVICES TARGETING ADDICTION, REHABILITATION AND TREATMENT) PROGRAM TO HELP SERVE THE NEEDS OF INMATES BEFORE THEY ARE RELEASED TO PREVENT RECIDIVISM. RESTART HAS 4 MAJOR PROGRAM COMPONENTS - CORRECTIONAL EDUCATION, SUBSTANCE ABUSE TREATMENT, SOCIAL WORK, AND OFFENDER REENTRY - THAT EMPHASIZES THE IMPORTANCE OF IDEALS THAT REDUCE RECIDIVISM. RESTART WILL HAVE TWO PILOT SITES WITH AN AVERAGE POPULATION OF 2,900 OFFENDERS.

CONCERNS WITH AGING ADULT CORRECTIONAL FACILITIES

MARYLAND HAS 28 TOTAL CORRECTION FACILITIES WITH AN AVERAGE AGE OF 45 YEARS.
