Demographics And Road Mileage

Summary

General Demographics

- **The 16 states of the Southern Legislative Conference (SLC):**
 - ◆ **Are home to 38.1% of the nation's population;**
 - ◆ **Account for 38.8% of the nation's licensed drivers;**
 - ◆ **Account for 40.4% of the nation's young licensed drivers (19 & under);**
 - ◆ **Account for 38.5% of the nation's registered motor vehicles; and**
 - ◆ **Account for 42.7% of the nation's vehicle miles traveled.**
- **SLC states have slightly fewer registered vehicles per licensed driver (1.19) than has the entire United States (1.2).**
- **However, there are more miles driven annually per licensed driver in SLC states (16,225) as opposed to the nation as a whole (14,726).**

Road Mileage

- **The 16 states of the SLC account for 39.7% of the nation's road miles.**
- **More of the roads in the SLC region are under state control (30%) compared to the nation as a whole (20%).**
- **A majority of all road miles are state maintained in only four SLC states (North Carolina, South Carolina, Virginia, and West Virginia).**






Young Drivers as a Percentage of All Licensed Drivers 2007

VEHICLES PER LICENSED DRIVER 2007



Summary


- **Per capita federal highway spending in the SLC states ranges from a high of \$248 in West Virginia to a low of \$109 in Florida.**
- **The FY 2007 Federal Apportionment/Payment ratio was at least 1.00 for all of the 16 SLC states. The FY 2007 ratio ranges from a high of 1.96 in West Virginia to a low of 1.0 in Texas.**
- **For FY 2007, the Federal Apportionment/Payment ratio for the entire SLC region was 1.1.**
- **Over the history of the Federal Highway Trust Fund, 8 of the 16 SLC states have an Apportionment/Payment ratio under 1.00, making them "donor states." Only five SLC states (Alabama, Louisiana, Maryland, Mississippi, and West Virginia) have a historical ratio greater than the U.S. ratio of 1.11.**




Per Capita Federal Highway Spending 2007

Summary

- **The gas tax rates in this table come from the American Petroleum institute and may include local option taxes, sales taxes, or environmental fees as noted.**
- **In 2006 SLC states collected just over \$15 billion in motor fuel taxes, 39.5% of the total fuel tax revenue of all the states.**
- **In 2003, SLC states accounted for almost 77 billion gallons of fuel use; 42.6% of the nation's total.**

- **Information on transit receipts and disbursements is for 2006**
- **Six SLC states (Florida, Georgia, Maryland, Missouri, North Carolina, and Texas) account for over 90% of the disbursements for transit capital outlay in the SLC region.**
- **Four SLC states (Florida, Georgia, Maryland, and Texas) account for almost three-quarters of disbursements for transit operations in the SLC region.**
- **Disbursements for both transit operations and capital outlay in the SLC states account for 14.7% of such disbursements nationwide.**





Summary


- **The SLC Region has nearly the same percentage of state maintained bridges that are substandard (21.4%) when compared to that of the nation as a whole (21.6%).**


