What is the Problem?



60% of all WV's children are needy



WV has an obesity rate of over 30%



WV has one of the nations lowest median incomes at \$39,170



WV has a child food insecurity rate of 21.1%



What is the creative solution?



Primary Goal: Feed to Achieve will ensure that every child in WV has access to a minimum of two nutritious meals per day.



3 Major Provisions

- 1. Builds upon Federal Child Nutrition Programs
- 2. Creates public-private partnerships

3. Annual reporting to the WV Legislature

The West Virginia Feed to Achieve Law Requires All Schools to:

- Establish a fund that creates a mechanism for counties to receive contributions and donations from the public and private sectors, which are tax deductible.
- Develop public-private partnerships to help eliminate hunger in WV
- WV is currently launching a Feed to Achieve marketing campaign to support this endeavor



Innovative Breakfast Strategies

75% of WV Schools Reported Implementing a Breakfast Strategy During the 2013-2014 School Year up from 58% during the 2012-2013 School Year

Innovative Programs during school year 2013-2014:

Breakfast in the Classroom: 126 schools

Grab-N-Go: 311 schools

Breakfast After First: 82 schools



Since the Feed to Achieve Law passed, WV has:

- Breakfast has increased from 114,244 to 125,407 that's 31,163 more students breakfast per day!
- 330 schools in 38 of 55 counties offering free breakfast and lunch to ALL students
- Purchased over 1 million dollars of local foods for the National School Breakfast and Lunch Program
