

STRATEGIES FOR DRUG CONTROL EFFORTS:
MILITARY ASSISTANCE TO STATE AND LOCAL GOVERNMENTS

On October 14, 1982, President Reagan announced his national initiatives to combat drug smuggling and organized crime.

In cooperation and concert with this important national anti-drug thrust, the Southern Legislative Conference hereby urges Congress to instruct the National Guard Bureau of the Departments of the Army and the Air Force to revise the federal regulations to broaden and materially increase the scope of the National Guard participation. In particular, we recommend revising those regulations allowing for increased flying hours for National Guard aircraft and allow civilian participation in training flights, which is currently prohibited, in order to improve overall drug enforcement capability.
