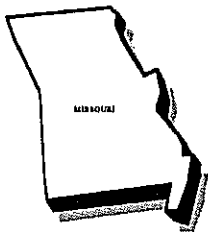

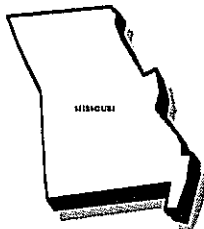

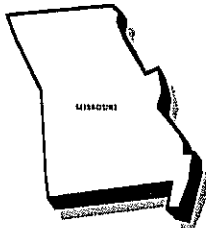

THE MISSOURI DEPARTMENT OF CORRECTIONS IS NOT CURRENTLY UNDER A FEDERAL OR STATE COURT ORDER DURING THE YEAR ENDING JUNE 30, 2005.

STATE INITIATIVES

ELDERLY OR INFIRMED INMATES

IN GENERAL, MISSOURI HAS ITS ELDERLY INMATES MAINSTREAMED IN THE REGULAR POPULATION. THE DEPARTMENT OF CORRECTIONS OPERATES ONE 30-BED HOUSING AREA WHERE INMATES OF THIS TYPE LIVE TOGETHER, BUT THEY CONTINUE TO PARTICIPATE IN MOST GENERAL ACTIVITIES. MEDICAL SERVICES ARE CONTRACTED ON A PER DIEM BASIS FOR THE ENTIRE POPULATION, SO NO SPECIFIC MEDICAL COSTS ARE EXPERIENCED. THERE IS ALSO NO SPECIFIC FUNDING OR LEGISLATION THAT ADDRESSES THE ELDERLY INMATES. MISSOURI ALLOWS INMATES WITH SERIOUS MEDICAL PROBLEMS TO BE CONSIDERED FOR PAROLE.

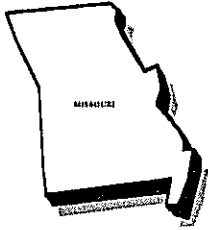

MISSOURI ALSO HAS TWO PARTIAL DAY PROGRAMS. THERE ARE 100 BEDS TOTAL; 45 ARE MANDATED FOR OFFENDERS AT ST. JOSEPH AND 65 BEDS AT TIPTON CORRECTIONAL CENTER. PARTIAL DAY TREATMENT PROGRAMS TOTAL 160 HOURS PROVIDED OVER 10 WEEKS.

PRISON BASED SUBSTANCE ABUSE TREATMENT PROGRAMS (CONTINUED)

MISSOURI HAS 8 INSTITUTIONAL TREATMENT CENTERS AND 3 OUTPATIENT MODEL TREATMENT PROGRAMS PROVIDING PROGRAMS FROM 10 WEEKS TO 12 MONTHS IN LENGTH. IN FY 05 APPROXIMATELY 8,200 OFFENDERS ATTENDED INSTITUTIONAL SUBSTANCE ABUSE TREATMENT. AT ANY ONE TIME, THERE ARE 2,600 OFFENDERS ENGAGED IN TREATMENT. THE TOTAL COST ASSOCIATED WITH BOTH TESTING AND SUBSTANCE ABUSE TREATMENT DURING FISCAL YEAR 2005 WAS \$7.8 MILLION. OFFENDER SUCCESS IS EVALUATED ON THE BASIS OF THE SATISFACTORY COMPLETION OF THEIR TREATMENT PLANS AS WELL AS SATISFACTORY OFFENDER CONDUCT. RECIDIVISM AND POST PROGRAM BEHAVIOR IS TRACKED THROUGH A PROGRAM TRACKING SYSTEM, AS WELL AS DEPARTMENT AND DIVISION OUTCOME STUDIES.

PRE-RELEASE/POST-RELEASE ("REENTRY") PROGRAMS

MISSOURI HAS TWO SUCH RE-ENTRY INITIATIVES, THE SERIOUS AND VIOLENT OFFENDER RE-ENTRY INITIATIVE (SVORI) AND TRANSITION FROM PRISON TO COMMUNITY INITIATIVE (TPCI), WHICH ARE BEING MELDED INTO THE MISSOURI RE-ENTRY PROCESS (MRP). BOTH OF THESE PROGRAMS OFFER ASSISTANCE FOR OFFENDERS TRANSITIONING BACK INTO THE COMMUNITY. IN THE MISSOURI RE-ENTRY PROCESS, OFFENDERS ARE REQUIRED TO DEVELOP A TRANSITION ACCOUNTABILITY PLAN (TAP) PRIOR TO THEIR RELEASE. SVORI AND TPCI WORK WITH A VARIETY OF STATE AND LOCAL AGENCIES TO PROVIDE THE SERVICES NEEDED UPON RE-ENTRY FOR A SEAMLESS CONTINUITY OF CARE. EACH INSTITUTION WILL HAVE A TRANSITIONAL HOUSING UNIT WHERE AN OFFENDER WILL BE HOUSED SIX MONTHS SHORT OF THEIR RELEASE DATE. AT THIS TIME, THE OFFENDER WILL RECEIVE INTENSIVE RELAPSE PREPARATION. THE IMPACT ON RECIDIVISM IS ANTICIPATED TO BE A 12% REDUCTION.

CONCERNS WITH AGING ADULT CORRECTIONAL FACILITIES

MISSOURI HAS 24 TOTAL INSTITUTIONS. THE OLDEST IS 73, WHILE THE NEWEST FACILITY IS ONLY ONE YEAR OLD. MAINTAINING FACILITIES IS ALWAYS AN ONGOING ISSUE. SEVERAL YEARS AGO A FACILITIES MAINTENANCE FUND (FMRF) WAS CREATED BY THE LEGISLATURE. STATUTE REQUIRES THAT A CERTAIN PERCENTAGE OF GENERAL REVENUE BE TRANSFERRED INTO THAT FUND TO MAINTAIN STATE BUILDINGS. CORRECTIONS HAS RECEIVED \$25.7 MILLION OF FMRF TO DO MAJOR MAINTENANCE AND REPAIRS (OVER \$25,000). IN ADDITION, DOC HAS RECEIVED \$1.2 MILLION FOR OPERATIONAL MAINTENANCE (UNDER \$25,000). SINCE MISSOURI HAS NOT HAD ANY OPERATION MAINTENANCE OR OPERATING BUDGET INCREASE FOR SEVERAL YEARS, THIS FUNDING DOES NOT GO AS FAR AS IT ONCE DID. MANY PREVENTATIVE MAINTENANCE ITEMS ARE DEFERRED, WHICH CAUSES THE COST OF THE REPAIR TO GO UP IN FUTURE YEARS.
